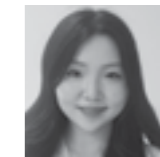
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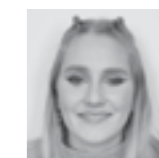
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

## Surgical Draping

Skills required for an effective surgical aseptic environment

## Four-Handed Dentistry for the Dental Team

Working together as a team to deliver productive and efficient dental treatment

Presented by Cathy Shiel, Lynette Shaw

Working together to  
deliver better care

### COURSE SUMMARY

This hands-on course will provide training for the dental team to help them work together productively and efficiently. Demonstrations will show how to lessen fatigue, reduce stress levels, improve posture and work together as a cohesive team. Strategies will also be provided to improve dental assistants' skills in anticipating the next steps of a procedure.

Participants will be shown how to make minimal movements throughout the procedure to facilitate four-handed dentistry. Emphasis will be placed on accomplishing a smooth-flowing process, where each member of the dental team knows what is expected of them, allowing the dentist to concentrate only on the dental treatment being carried out and not what is happening around them.

Topics demonstrated include maintaining infection control, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), benefits of four-handed dentistry, understanding Transfer Zones, correct positioning of operators, how to transfer instruments, position the light, triplex and suction correctly, and full mouth rinsing techniques.

## Dental Care of the Patient with Cancer

Identify how cancer adversely impacts patients' oral health and dental treatment

### Best practice to support cancer patients

#### COURSE SUMMARY

Cancer is on the rise with more patients undergoing cancer treatments, surviving cancer, and living with cancer. Established therapies, surgery, radiotherapy and chemotherapy are continuously evolving, and cause significant morbidity and adverse dental/oral complications and manifestations. Newer therapies, such as the biologic agents, the small molecules agents (TKIs) and the immune-modifying agents are also resulting in unexpected dental/oral complications and adverse effects. The risk of Medication-Related Osteonecrosis of the Jaws (MRONJ) is also becoming more common.

Enrol today for a full-day event which addresses the basic concepts regarding the management of cancer, the safe delivery of dental treatment and how these can impact adversely on our patients' dental and oral health.

## Oral Medicine for the General Dental Practitioner

A straightforward approach to recognition and diagnosis of significant oral pathologies

#### COURSE SUMMARY

Patients present with seemingly a bewildering range of diseases and disorders of the oral cavity and the stomatognathic system – the TMJ's, salivary glands, muscles, nerves and the lips. This course aims to provide a straightforward approach to recognition and diagnosis of significant oral pathologies such as oral cancer and potentially malignant oral disorders, painful oral conditions and complex oro-facial pain.

## Management of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Practice

- Use of drugs including Aspirin, Adrenaline, Salbutamol, Glycerol Trinitrate and Glucose

## Forensic Odontology

Piecing together the puzzle

Presented by the NSW Forensic Education Committee

### COURSE SUMMARY

This two-day course will introduce participants to forensic odontology's scope and practice with particular emphasis on disaster victim identification.

The utilisation of dental techniques for human identification is simple in concept but complex in process. The NSW Forensic Education Committee will guide participants through the inter-related processes and procedures utilised in a disaster event. Presentations on the Asian Tsunami and other mass fatality incidents will be used to illustrate the process.

A practical component with a mock disaster exercise is held in the main mortuary. Exercises in tooth identification, antemortem and post-mortem radiographic matching and age estimation from radiographic evidence are also components of the course.

Participants will have a greater understanding of the value of their clinical records' quality in the identification process.

The NSW Government has invested \$91.5 million to create a world-class Forensic Medicine & Coroners Court Complex. It is the largest facility of its kind in Australia and represents a significant leap forward for coronial investigations in NSW.

The extensive high-tech facilities will enable more comprehensive coronial investigations of sudden and unexplained deaths, including complex cases and disasters involving mass casualties.

- Live demonstration of the first dentist appointment, best practice screening questionnaires and history taking techniques.

In addition, demystify occlusal splints, with practical, take-home suggestions for when to use which type of splint and why, and learn how you can assemble your own local multidisciplinary team in private practice to better support your patients.

## Practical Radiography in Dental Practice

Opportunities and challenges of 2D and 3D imaging

Accurate radiographs are essential to make a correct diagnosis, deliver positive treatment outcomes, assess long-term results and provide medico-legal protection. Conventional 2D images remain the mainstay of dental treatment. This hands-on course will use two holders that operate across all 2D platforms and give you the best results, including taking an accurate and repeatable endodontic image with a rubber dam in place. The 2D discussion will also include techniques and interpretation of OPG images.

The 3D or CBCT imaging aspect will highlight the advances in diagnosis and treatment planning that CBCT provides. In addition, you will learn how to interpret CBCT images, use generic imaging software to its maximum advantage, better understand the medical implications of 3D imaging and recognise the difference between artefacts and pathological conditions.

Participants will know how to successfully image any part of the mouth, manage gagging, apply the “buccal object rule” in both the horizontal and vertical planes, identify pathology and artefacts in 2D, OPG and 3D images and fully understand the medico-legal implications of 3D imaging.

## The Microscope for the General Practitioner: Parts I & II

Learn how the microscope can improve your practice

Presented by Dr Steven Cohn, Dr Tim McNulty, Dr Sabrina Manickam, Ms Barbara Faulkner

### Expand your microscope skills in all dental disciplines

#### COURSE SUMMARY

This two-part “hands on” course will discuss how the enhanced magnification and illumination provided by the dental operating microscope can be applied to almost all clinical situations. These include the diagnosis of caries, cracks and fractures, pit and fissure restorations, all stages of cavity, veneer and crown preparations and endodontic, periodontal and oral surgery procedures.

The microscope is already considered the standard of care in many dental specialties, and its use in general practice is growing. By encouraging good posture, the microscope benefits the health of the dentist and the chairside assistant. When combined

with documentation facilities, the microscope is an excellent tool for patient education, record keeping and legal defence.

Please be advised that dentists wishing to attend both ‘Part 1’ and ‘Part 2’ will need to register for each event separately.

#### Part One: Wednesday 7 August 2024

This day is for dentists who either have never used a microscope or have limited experience and wish to increase their knowledge. This course will improve your use of the microscope in everyday clinical situations by providing “hands-on” exercises on teeth and clinically realistic tooth models.

#### Part Two: Thursday 8 August 2024

Day two will emphasise the team approach necessary when using the microscope. You are encouraged to bring

your chairside assistant on this day. Day two will emphasise training in four-handed dentistry specific to creating a microscope enhanced general practice, including the efficient use of rubber dam and other clinical skills.

- Adjusting and focusing the microscope
- Dentist, assistant and patient positioning for optimum results and improved posture
- Periodontal procedures
- Pit and fissure restorations
- Endodontic access cavities, canal location and instrumentation

## All-Ceramic Crowns and Veneers in Aesthetic Practice

Understanding the principles of smile design

Presented by Dr Christopher Ho

### COURSE SUMMARY

In the modern age of patients demanding more aesthetic and natural-looking restorations, this two-day course covers the use of ceramic restorations (porcelain veneers, onlays and crowns) from treatment planning, preparation and cementation. Dr Ho will emphasise a thorough clinical assessment with comprehensive planning of the patient using diagnostic wax-ups in anterior restorations' workup. Understanding the principles of smile design and communicating with patients will be emphasised and allow the practitioner to plan cases predictably.

The myriad different ceramics available will be discussed with their indications and alternative approaches to their implementation. Preparation and provisionalisation

techniques will be practiced within an intensive hands-on workshop, and participants will be expected to complete multiple preparations of porcelain veneers, onlays and crowns.

The evolution of different ceramics has made the area of cementation somewhat confusing with questions being asked - "Do I need to cement this or should I bond this?" Other cementation techniques from conventional, self-adhesive to adhesive bonding will be explained and simplified with an outline when each method is indicated. Participants will practice what is sometimes a stressful procedure, the adhesive cementation of veneers, with useful tips and hints that will make this less nerve-racking.
